Greetings Family!

With the approaching WSC, I will be traveling for the next two weekends; therefore, I really needed to be here this weekend. Please accept this report in my absence.

- I attended the CAR workshop in Kalamazoo, MI the weekend of January 31 – February 1, 2004. I received valuable information about the CAR; however, the CAT was not covered. I also attended the COASCNA CAR workshop on February 6, 2004 that consisted of COASCNA, MEASCNA, and an addict from MVASCNA. Additionally, I attended the March 6, 2004 DASCNA workshop that included addicts from GCASCNA and HAMASCNA. In the CAT, there were 3 regions that have requested seating. If they are seated, they will not be funded to the WSC until 2006.
- I will be attending the WSC next weekend in Woodland Hills, CA. I remember from the January 2004 WSC that several addicts had an issue with the way in which the sponsorship book was compiled, and I intend to voice that at the conference. If there are any other concerns that you want to have addressed, please email them to me along with ORSCNA's vote on the CAR motions.
- There is now an issue discussion bulletin board on www.na.org. The following IP's are also available on the 'net: Who, What, How, and Why; NA: A Resource in Your Community; Welcome to Narcotics Anonymous, For the Newcomer; Am I an Addict?; and For Those in Treatment. Additionally, A Guide to World Services and A Guide to Local Services have been posted on the internet.

- The WSO will examine ways to facilitate a connection between incarcerated members and members of the fellowship who may be willing to help these addicts work the steps. They will not be directly answering letters, but rather act as a coordinator.
- Videos of the WCNA will not be made available at this time. This is because there are full-face views of addicts who identify themselves as NA members, and once the video is released, there would be no control of how the tape would be used.
- WCNA-31 will be held 1-4 September 2005 in Honolulu. The next convention will be 29 August – 2 September 2007 in San Antonio, followed by 2009 in Europe or the Middle East.
- Product Updates: There will be new medallion designs this year. There will also be a sample of We Do Recover as a group reading, as well as a sample of the Third Step Prayer poster currently in inventory that incorporates the phrase, “Many of us have said...” in the beginning.
- The HRP has sent 357 letters to addicts who met the clean time requirements for HRP, WSC Cofacilitator, and WB positions. After receiving the initial letters of interest back, the HRP then sent another acknowledging receipt of the potential nominees’ responses, and asked them to update personal contact info. Only 117 responded favorably. A blind evaluation process was used, and 95 addicts continued the process. Two candidates have withdrawn.
- I would also like to express my interest and desire to run for RD again, and will submit my nomination form as an attachment. I am also requesting reimbursement gas and lodging for the Kalamazoo, MI CAR workshop for \$129.25 (please mail it to me).
