Hi family,

Last quarter was filled with activity CAR/CAT workshops, MZF meeting, IDT workshops, MARLCNA and visiting ASC meetings. We are fortunate today to have access to a lot of information to allow us to more effectively carry our message of recovery. Our fellowship is growing in numbers and our service structure has to support the growth. We held workshops this conference cycle to gather information on what we can do to help carry our message. We will look at the inventory information this afternoon and see areas that we can improve in. We will always be improving our ways of carrying our message as we continue to grow. While our message has remained the same our methods of delivering it are being challenged. Through visits to different areas I have seen many areas struggle with not having strong homegroups with trusted servants. I hear a lot a criticism toward the trusted servants who are doing their best with limited resources. I attended two CAT/CAR workshop where World Board members where present and a lot of the discussion was on keytags and literature. At our MZF meeting in Chicago we reaffirmed our commitment to continue doing workshops through this next conference cycle. This is an improvement over the MZF's of the past. There were regions that were experiencing problems with conventions. The speaker message, financial losses and being the main source of support were some of the concerns. We have a video MZF presentation for WSC. This WSC is going to be discussion based. We have a lot of challenges facing our fellowship. New literature on the new IP's concerning money and support are examples of an area we need improvement in. The same dollar in the basket that we had in the past is not enough for today challenges. I have copies of some thoughts of the World Board about our future service systems that we will discuss this afternoon at the RD/RCM meeting. There are several models and remember these are only at the discussion stage. The service system work group has two more years. I am looking forward to participating in The WSC. We the Ohio Region have a lot to offer. Diversity in our region is one of our strengths. This diversity was expressed at our IDT workshops and activities. As you can see there is a lot of work to be done if we want to effectively carry our message.

I have talked to members of the IWANA area and some of the groups have joined other areas. I haven't heard it officially from the trusted servants.

I received \$700 for the MZF. Expenses were \$194.66 hotel fee, \$402.80 for two airline tickets, \$44.69 for food and \$21.00 for airport parking for a total of \$663.15. I am returning \$36.85

We will be doing a literature review and input workshop at OCNA on one of the new chapters of "Living Clean"

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve as the Ohio Region delegate and will seek another term.

### **Midwest Zonal Forum & Multi-Regional CAR/CAT Workshop:**

Soon after our last meeting, Dale & I were able to attend a meeting of the Midwest Zonal Forum (MZF) and participate in a Multi-Regional CAR (Conference Agenda Report) / CAT (Conference Approval Track) Workshop which was hosted by the Chicagoland Region on February 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup>.

### **Area / Multi-Area CAR/CAT Workshops:**

As planned at our last meeting, Dale & I facilitated a Regional (Multi-Area) CAR/CAT Workshop in Springfield, OH on February 28<sup>th</sup>, with representation from at least eight Areas. I believe this had the desired effect of empowering local NA members to facilitate similar Workshops in their own Areas. Additionally, I was also able to assist in the facilitation of local CAR/CAT Workshops in the Five Rivers Area on March 20<sup>th</sup> and the Hamilton/Middletown Area on April 3<sup>rd</sup>.

### **Regional Report to WSC 2010:**

Our Region's report to the 2010 World Service Conference (WSC) was submitted on time, and a copy of this report has been sent to the Secretary for inclusion in the minutes. Thanks to each of you who helped in the development of this report.

Some thoughts that occurred to me in compiling this information... It would be helpful if Areas got in the habit of regularly including the statistical data (e.g. number of NA groups, NA meetings, and H&I panels that occur on a weekly basis) in their quarterly reports; and including other information (e.g. the monetary value of literature donated annually for H&I and PR efforts, information on other Area services, and app. attendance at Area NA conventions) in a more detailed report to the Region each January.

### **2010 World Service Conference:**

Travel arrangements to attend the 2010 World Service Conference have been finalized and I was able to secure round trip airfare for a total cost of \$236.80 (much less than anticipated) – flying out of Dayton on the morning of Friday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> and returning on the evening of Sunday, May 9<sup>th</sup>. Pre-Conference activities begin on Saturday morning (April 24<sup>th</sup>) and the Conference runs through the following Saturday (May 1<sup>st</sup>), hence I've made arrangements to share a room with Dale at the Conference hotel site (Warner Center Marriott in Woodland Hills, CA) for nine nights (April 23<sup>rd</sup> – May 1<sup>st</sup>) at the rate of \$79.30 per night (tax included) for a cost to the Region of \$713.70. I will be asking for this amount to be advanced from the Region. I estimate that incidental expenses (such as long-term parking, ground transportation and special luncheon activities connected with the Conference) may be in the range of \$100.00 - \$150.00, and I will present receipts for these items at the July RSC meeting for reimbursement. As with my prior Conference experiences, my extended stay in Southern California will be at my own expense.

Once again, thanks for allowing me to serve the fellowship of Narcotics Anonymous and our Ohio Region.

#### **Convention XXVIII**

It is great to be here with all of you today and I am happy that Spring has arrived. Before I report on each area of the Convention Committee I can summarize it by saying, all the major decisions have been made and almost all the planning work is finished. Sure, there are some Fund-Raisers to attend and a few checks to write, but other than that we're just working out some details and waiting for Memorial Day Weekend. You may remember our Vice-Chair position had been open since last fall but Donald R. stepped forward and was voted in a couple months ago. We're all glad to have him on board and he wasted no time pitching in to help us keep moving forward. When it became clear to the Committee that Arts & Graphics would remain an open position the decision was made to utilize the original pre-convention design as the Convention Logo and incorporate our theme with it. Our new Vice-Chair handled the proposals and production of the Banner. It'll be ready by our next meeting which is April 25. There will be only one additional meeting (May 16) before the start of the Convention.

Moving on to Registration. The packets that will be issued at the Registration Table consist of a small padfolio with a pen. The printed program along with any tickets fit neatly inside. All of it has been ordered. We expect to hit our goal of 75 pre-registrations by opening day but we still need 200 people to walk through the door and register on Friday and Saturday. You can help us encourage people to attend by announcing it through April and May at all the meetings in your Home Areas. If anyone refuses to cooperate just let me know, (because I know a guy). Please remind everyone that the flyer and map can be found on the Web at NAOHIO.org. Registration will accept cash or money orders only, no checks. The Programming Sub-Committee has lined up 40 speakers for the 20 workshops. RCMs from both Regions in Ohio have been invited to Chair the workshops and there are morning meditations on Saturday and Sunday. Five main speakers have been confirmed and travels arrangements have been made. They are from California, Texas, North Carolina, Maryland and Ohio. Display boards for all events and areas of the Convention have been made and people have been assigned to keep them accurate and up to date. A recording company has been contracted to produce and sell cd's of workshops and speaker meetings. The marathon meeting will be located in a suite of the host hotel and will run almost continually through out the Convention.

There has been one surprise in the area of Hotels & Hospitality. The Holiday Inn (overflow hotel) has changed its name to Howard Johnson's. While the address and phone number is the same and our arrangements with them are intact, there could be some confusion with the new Holiday Inn that just got built down the street. The front desk staffs at each hotel understand the situation and we have been assured that if people arrive at or call the wrong hotel they will be directed to Howard Johnson's. The flyer on the Web has already been updated and the name change has been highlighted. Vicci H. (Hotel Chair) and I will be meeting with the Director of the Lima Civic Center soon to verify some of the details in our contract (number of tables, chairs, etc.). The caterer has our banquet menu and we will commit to the number of meals two weeks before the event, assuming we can find a OUIJI Board. Seriously, if you want to attend the banquet, you better pre-register, and don't say we didn't warn ya. OCNA 28 Merchandise being sold at the Convention will include t-shirts, bracelets, Frisbees and tumblers. NA related jewelry will also be available in the Merchandising room. In addition to that, the Merchandising Sub-Committee plans to raffle off an assortment of unique NA related items during the weekend. The Security Sub-Committee has the walkie-talkies together which will allow direct communication between their people and Convention Committee members. They have also used the walk-through along with a diagram of the Convention Site (including parking areas) to determine assignments and scheduling of stationary and roving Serenity Keepers. We don't really expect any problems but we're prepared just in case. I should also note that the

young ladies dance recitals in the Civic Theater on Saturday have been cancelled or rescheduled for reasons that are not yet clear. So, we'll have the place to ourselves. Toga! Toga! Toga!

While no members with special needs have pre-registered so far, proposals for ASL interpreters have been received and we'll take action on that as soon as it becomes necessary. Jerry C. is our new Special Needs Chairperson. He has reached out to related community organizations and is committed to providing whatever additional assistance is required by NA members attending the Convention. The Welcoming Sub-Committee has just about completed their maps of the local area and centerpiece designs. I hear they've been holding "hugging practice" but I can never seem to get invited. Our Fund-Raising people have been running their asses off representing OCNA 28 at events all over the state. David O. and Merricle H. have done an amazing job of keeping track of the Fund-Raisers and coordinating with everyone to sell raffle tickets, merchandise and auction items. We would like to thank all the Areas, Groups, and individual NA members who have supported us so far with your efforts and donations. The drawing for the Complete Convention Package for two (including hotel) will be held at the NWOASCNA OCNA 28 Fund-Raiser in Lima on April 24. There are still some tickets available. Sales of raffle tickets for the 1<sup>st</sup> Edition Basic Text have been strong. There are a little over 100 tickets left, so if you want some, don't wait. I believe there's a good chance we'll sell out sometime in May. We have a contract with a comedian for the show on Friday Night. He's a seasoned professional comic out of L.A. with many years clean, who specializes in "Recovery Comedy" and he's an absolute wild man. It's a real bargain at \$12/ticket and there's no "two drink minimum". Also, Fund-Raising & Entertainment has contracted with our own Charles F. to D.J. the big Saturday Night Dance. We're all looking forward to it.

And now for the numbers, financially, things look pretty good. We have \$3400 and no unpaid bills. The most recent Budget projection estimates our total expenses close to \$17,000 with projected income around \$24,000. I want to remind everyone again that the current projected revenue of \$7,000 from the Ohio Convention is an estimate and hinges on many factors such as 200 - 300 registrations and selling all our merchandise. A power outage downtown or severe weather around the state could turn this whole thing upside down and we'll be struggling to break even. Although the OCNA 28 Convention Committee has worked hard to manage NA Funds responsibly, by providing a quality Convention at reasonable prices, making money is not the purpose of NA Conventions. This Committee decided as a group early on, that the purpose of this year's Convention is to carry the message of HOPE and provide a celebration of our Recovery. I encourage everyone in the Fellowship to further your Recovery and join us in Lima on May 28, 29 & 30. Finally, I want to thank all of you (ORSCNA) for allowing me to serve in this position and for your encouragement and support. Doing this job (on top of everything else) has helped make this, one of the best years of my life. It's possible that being clean might have something to do with it also. Thanks for your help with that too.
